



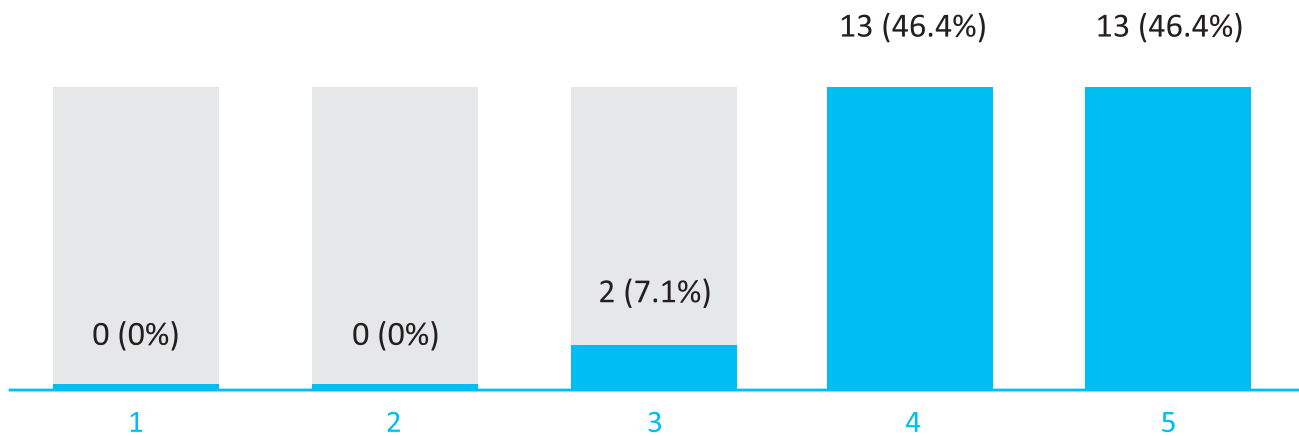

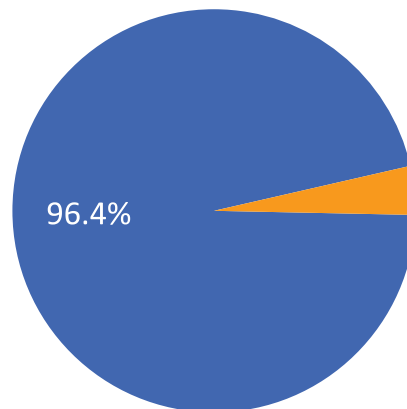

1. Unfortunately, All Stars isn't what it used to be. It used to be the best of the town leagues but travel teams have taken over and it's beyond our control. While the integrity of the original All Stars tournaments will always be important, we're implementing a travel program to try and be more aggressive. However, it is important to know that all of our players- not just those in travel- will always be eligible for All Stars. All stars is more than just talent and players are chosen based on performance, attitude, and many other factors throughout the season.

2. Amount of teams determines if we can have other divisions on the Major and Babe Ruth fields. We schedule them if and when we can.

3. We only have so many fields so coaches need to coordinate with each other for practice time and utilize other locations throughout town if need be.

## How satisfied were you with the amount of games for each division you were part of?

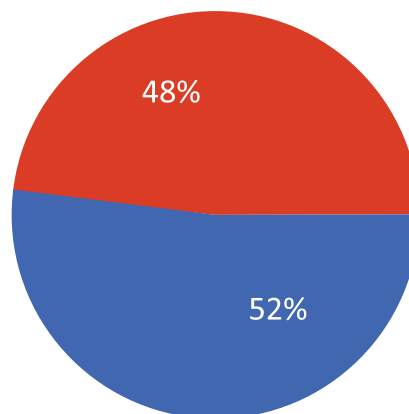

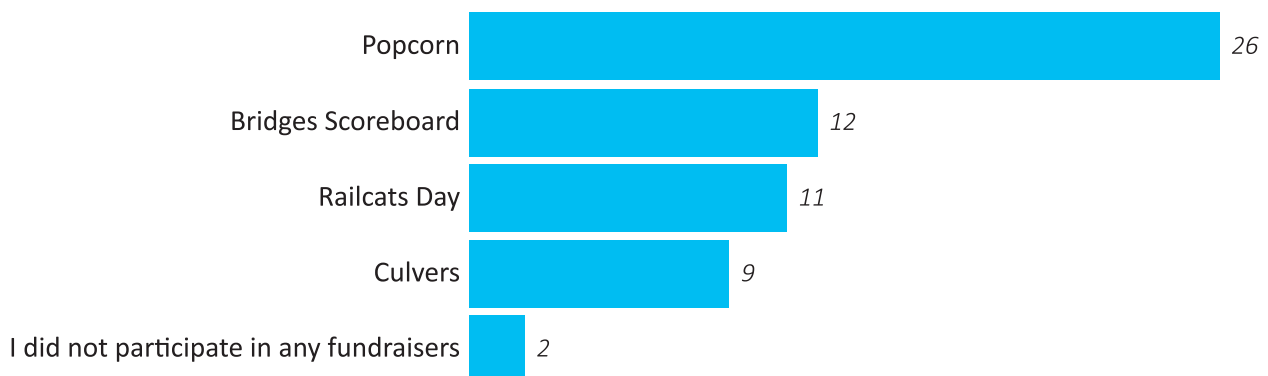

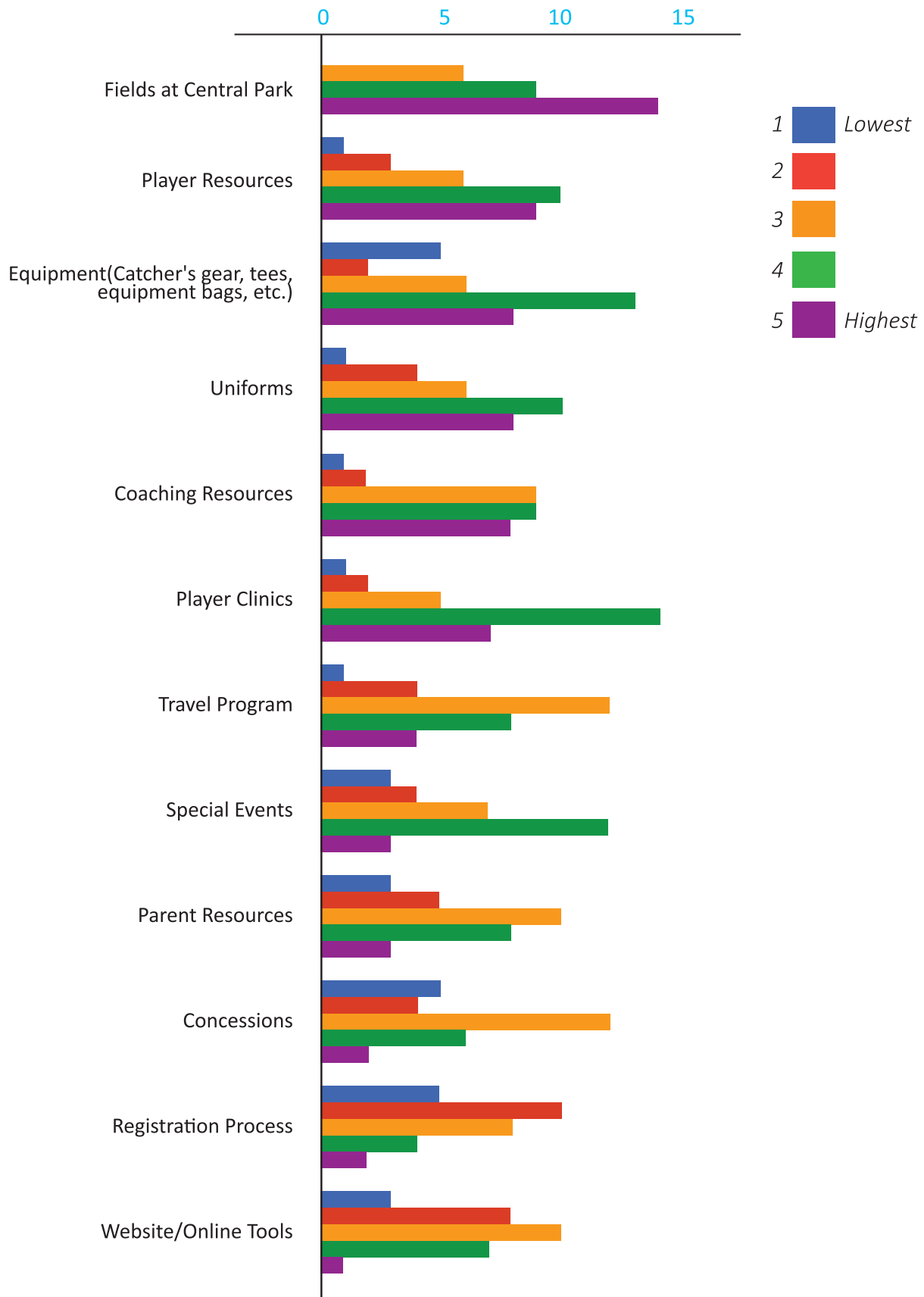

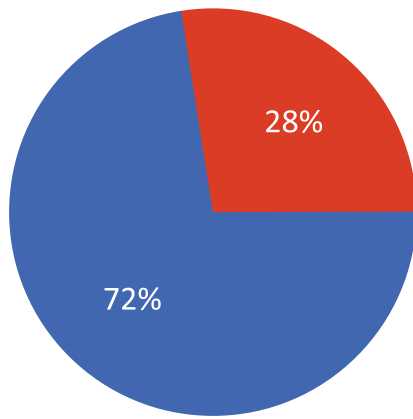

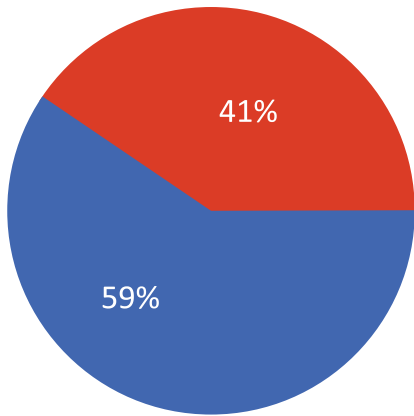

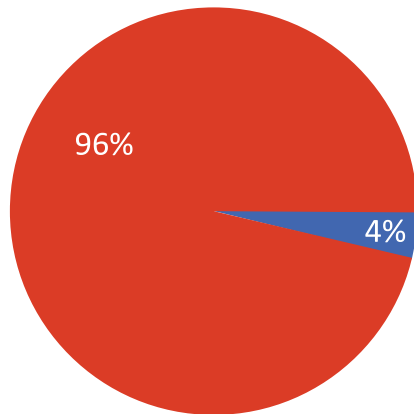

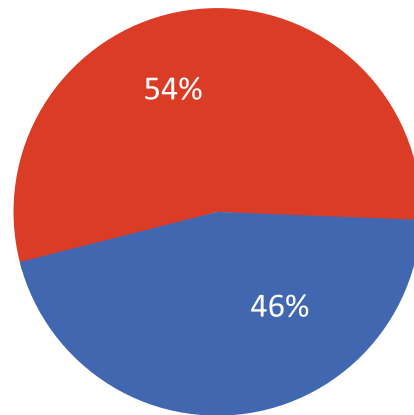

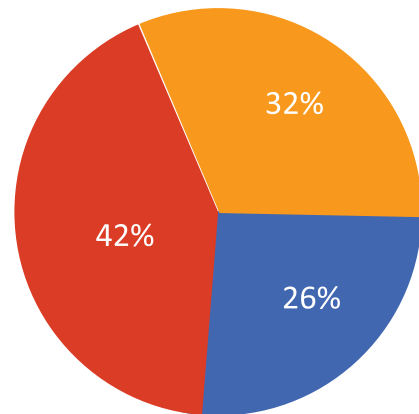

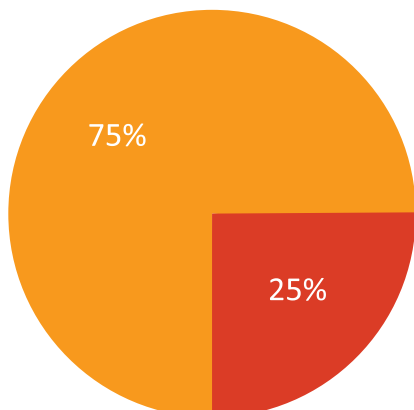


**As a Manager, how was your level of responsibility?**

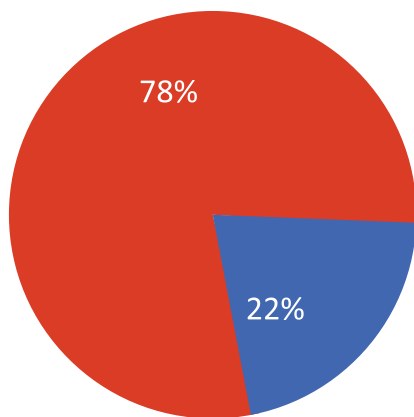


**As a Coach, how was your level of responsibility?**

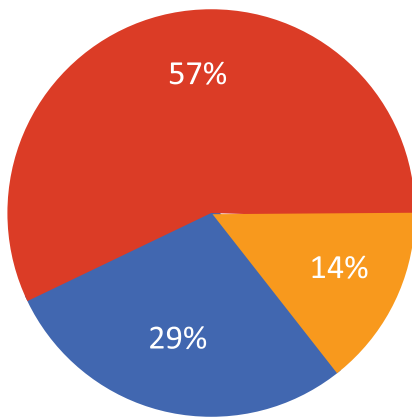
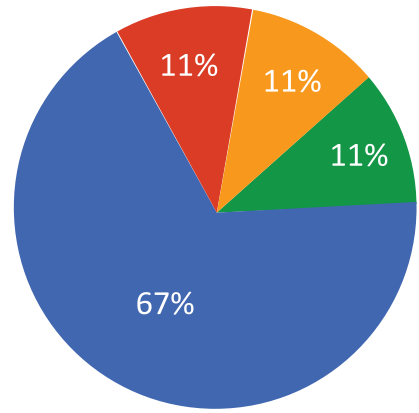

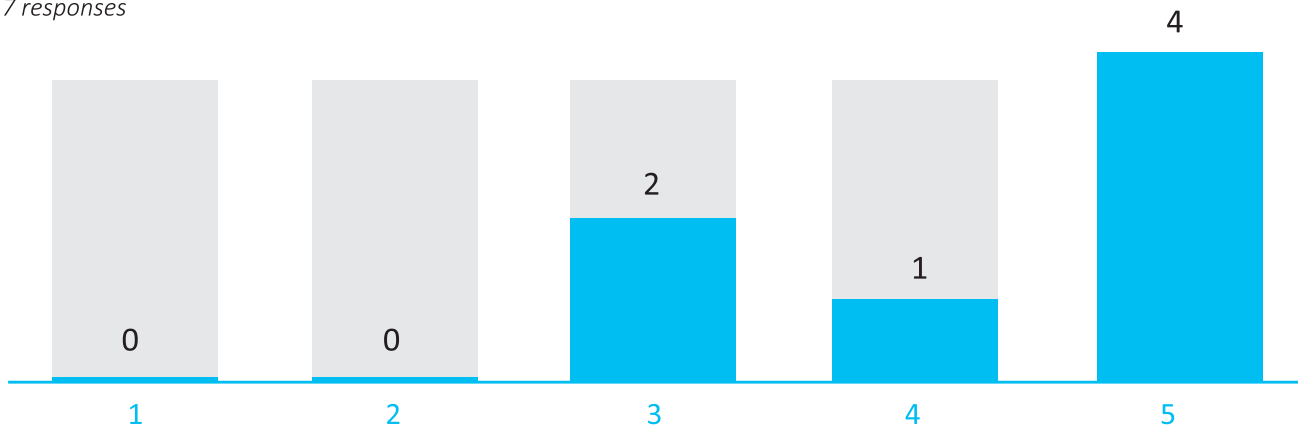

19. All Stars is a season long tryout and teams are chosen by all of the Managers in each specific division. They get together and choose the players based on performance, talent, attitude, and other factors. Coaches kids make it only if deserved, however, we would never expect someone to coach if their child didn't play. (We did have an amazing coach that did that this year though.) We would never skip a child playing if they were deserving. There is no specific number from each team, it's just the kids that the Managers choose collectively from all the players available for that age group. There is an All Star team for all of our age groups but only if we have Managers and Coaches to take a team. If no one steps up to do it, then we don't have a team. We're glad you spoke to Kyle and hope all of your concerns have been addressed.

It saddened me to see how often Kyle, Erin and Stevie were in the concession stand:( could we potentially hire it out like softball does or is our concession stand too much of a money maker? It dawned on me that when I sign up-I should pick times when my kid is playing so I don't miss his games-maybe others don't have that same thought. I wish I could volunteer more but between softball, baseball, sylvan, work in IL-seems like a time crunch all the time!

I think we can come up with bigger and better fundraisers. Maybe a raffle. How about a walk-a-thon or a play-a-thon? How about baseball square for the major league-sure it would be different from a football square but guessing it can be done like choose 4 innings for the final scores? Group garage sale or car wash (at the field we rent anyway) where all proceeds go to league? 50/50's at the games?

What about creating a wish list on Amazon and sharing with the parents for needed equipment, field maintenance items, office items, etc.

Can the kids pick their number?

I had no idea you had to rent the fields... what a pile of crap, shame on Griffith! Maybe this is normal and I just don't know, but that seems absurd to me. Who the hell else would rent it? Does Munster little league pay rent to Munster or Schererville little league to Schererville? Are the fields at St. Mary's belong to St. Mary's or the town? If St. Mary's do they charge rent?

It may be beneficial to actually show a breakdown of what is spent to keep the league going each season vs. how much money comes in. Many probably just don't know. I believe if you had to charge each player \$10 more will help too!

Another idea-charge \$50 or whatever more each player and say if you work 5 hours in the concession stand you earn it back.

Players clinic I think would be fantastic. Pitching, catching, fielding, batting!!! That would be cool. Charge for it too-potential fundraisers as well:) you have someone who may charge \$20 per player for a batting clinic: charge \$25 where \$5 back to the league.

Unfortunately we're unable to hire, especially the service that softball uses. Our league costs far outweigh theirs and we need the funds to pay for umpires, concession supplies/food, equipment, and other things throughout the season.

We're always open to new fundraiser ideas!

Picking numbers is reserved for our Babe Ruth players. They deserve a perk after playing for so long.

Regarding field rentals, we do lease from the town for the Central Park fields and we rent the fields from St. Mary's as they own theirs. St. Mary's rental fees are very minimal and they are always very accommodating and great with our needs.

We do go over costs during board meetings and information is posted a couple times a year. We encourage people to come to board meetings to find out more about the inner workings of the league.

We have discussed player clinics- and would love to get those going- but we do need more volunteers

31. We don't own the fields, St. Mary's does. We are pretty limited in what we can do there. If we were even able to update anything there, it would be a very large cost.

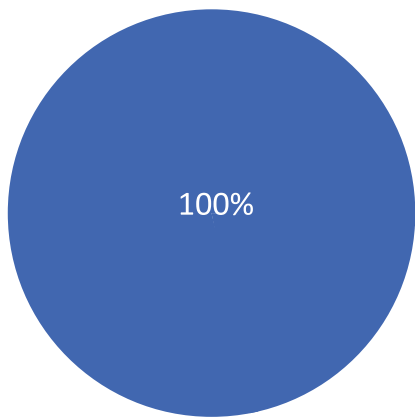
